Rules and Precautions

The course is held on open roads. Be cautious of vehicular traffic and obey course marshals. The course is marked with painted arrows and signage. Please wear your bib number and do not remove the tear tag until finished. Only cross the finish line one time.

Directions to Start Line

From the North:

Take I-5 southbound to exit #282A (Hubbard/Canby Exit)
Follow Hubbard Cutoff Road to Pacific HWY 99E Southbound. Continue through Hubbard and Woodburn to HWY 214. Turn Left at stoplight onto HWY 214 to Mt. Angel. (Approx. 15-miles), turn East on Marquam St, turn South on Alder St to Humpert Park.

From the South:

Take I-5 northbound to exit #256 and follow State HWY 213 through Silverton to Mt. Angel (Approx. 15-miles), in Mt. Angel turn East on Church St which becomes College St, then turn North on Alder St to Humpert Park.

Start location:

From Main Street in Mount Angel (North end of town), turn East on Marquam Street.
Past the Middle and High School then turn Right (South) onto Alder Street.
